
We had a short delay getting started; Richard was putting up his top on the 8. I think he had forgotten how after working on the 3 and couldn't find his side curtains.

TECH TIP: Dr. Colorchip product review

Dr. ColorChip is an automotive paint chip repair system widely advertised in auto journals. I ordered the basic kit (\$39) for my 21 year old Mustang GT online at drcolorchip.com. They use factory paint codes and have many Triumph colors dating from the '60's. Although the paint is a match to the factory code, it is **NOT** touch up paint found at the local parts store.

The kit consists of paint, a blending solution called SealAct, a brush, and directions, Fig. 1. It is applied in three unique steps.

I applied it to two sections of the Mustang door: the lower section below the trim strip that had accumulated the dreaded "road rash" (multiple small chips Fig. 6), and three chips, mid door, from careless parking lot encounters. Unfortunately these dings would not photograph on the highly reflective black surface or perhaps my camera skills are wanting. I'll comment later on the result.

To prep the surface and remove polish and wax, I used rubbing alcohol.

Step 1: Dab the paint on the chips with the brush or Q-tip. Fig. 2.

Step 2: Smear the paint immediately to flatten it across the chip. This special paint dries very quickly, Fig. 3. It will dry to the touch in two minutes and can be left for up to two hours before step 3.

Step 3: Blend and remove excess paint with the SealAct solution on a small cotton cloth and rubbing gently over the chips. Fig.'s 4 & 5. Let the chemical do the work, then immediately buff with a microfiber cloth.

Results: The door dings are gone. The road rash is greatly improved, Fig.'s 6 & 7, and would likely have disappeared if I had let the paint dry longer as I did on the dings. The chemical will lift the paint if used too soon. There is plenty of paint and solution left so I will treat more road rash in the future. I polished and waxed the car a few days later and the repair is steadfast. Put a **TRIUMPH** in your day!

What DO members do after selling their Spitfires and moving?


