

We have been going through all sorts of forgotten memories as we pack to move. Today Laraine presented me with a basket full of old papers. It seems they take forever to go through, and bring back a lot of forgotten stuff. Several have brought to mind our progress through the automotive part of our lives. I had forgotten that our British connection went back to our first new car, a "1960 Anglia De Luxe" English Ford. It was powder blue with white wall tires and a radio. Laraine went to Dallas to pick it up and when she got back to KC she didn't remember how to put it in reverse. We had never had a four speed & she just knew it was to the right. We drove it several days, and finally I got tired of pushing it back. I drove into the Mercury dealers. The service writer wanted to know what the problem was I told him it wouldn't shift into reverse. He got in and backed it up, and then he showed me you had to pull up on the shift lever to go into reverse. Gas was \$0.299 in 1960 a tank full averaged about \$2.00.


It would be 5 years and 3 new Fords before we got our first TR4 (64) our first second car. Of all people my Mother in Law called and told me there was a Triumph for sale by owner. I went to see it and bought it, a 1967 TR4A with the solid axle. It was only 3 months old. Both of our Triumphs were black with red interiors. We drove the 4A until we bought our farm in 1970. I had bought a 1930 Model A Coupe and was restoring it. Laraine laid the law down saying "I couldn't have my toys and the farm." So we went from Triumphs to pickups. Our next car was a 1971 Mercury Capri; I believe it was considered German.

Finally after getting three kids through school and married off, in 1999 I got my present 1967 TR4A IRS. I have since bought all of Herb's TR3 parts and 1 TR3 to restore and a TR3 and TR4 parts Cars; a TR4 to restore and I was given a 1980 TR7 to restore. I have really enjoyed my Triumphant Life, and hope to continue for more years.

If you have the time and inclination there is a wealth of information on our web site. Although it is stated that only newsletters from 2008 are searchable, I have found that if you type in, for example "Tech Tips", it will bring up articles as far back as Volume 9, 1986.

The newsletters begin with Volume 1 (1978) and continue to Volume 36 (2014) a total of 36 years! Each volume covers one year (6 issues).

Some examples:

The first volume, Issue 1 mentions: \$5 dues, and describes our first annual Dinner at Washington Street Station, the 1st Ozark Tour, and 1st rally. In Issue 6 Craig Simon is listed as a new member.

In Volume 6 issue 3, I wrote about my experience rebuilding the TR3 engine. Thanks to Richard Peak, the newsletter editor, it was submitted with photos to *Sports and GT Magazine* and published in their May 1984 issue.

Volume 20 issue 2, the featured car of the month is Larry Taylor's 1960 TR3. Another article described Bob White's incredible original low mileage 1959 TR3, his 1950 Triumph Renown, XK 120 DHC, and 1967 XKE coupe. Bob, now deceased, was the owner of White Haven Motel and an original member of KC Triumphs.

Volume 32 issue 2, Roger Elliott & Pat Fischer describe their trip from Kansas to California in a TR250 to attend the National VTR Convention of 2009. This travelogue is complete with many photos and descriptions of the events along the way.

Volume 34 issue 4, Steve Olsen's alliterative "**Wedge Words**" is a good example of his articles concerning TR8 Triumphs. Maintenance, repair and just living with are all covered in common sense.

There are some difficulties. Volumes 10 through 14 were scanned sideways and require a right click and rotation to right

them. Some of the copying and photos are not crystal clear but still readable. Years 2008 to present are excellent as they were digitally produced.

Oh, by the way, thanks to all of you who wished me well during my recent illness. It was much appreciated.

WEDGE WORDS

One of the few tiny things I altered on my TR8 was removing the warm air devices from the carb intakes. These seemingly harmless devices have a bi-metal flap that when cold shuts off the fresh air input and allows air that has been drawn in over the hot exhaust manifold to feed the carbs. Sometime in the mid 70s these or very similar devices were added to most every car. Their purpose is to first help the engine get up to normal operating temperature faster. An engine pollutes less and runs better when it is not cold. And second they prevent a phenomenon called carb icing. When a liquid evaporates it produces cooling. Before we had modern air conditioning we had swamp coolers that used this principle. So as your gasoline is drawn through the jet and gets


atomized in the venturi where it cools things down quite a bit. If the carb itself is cold and the air is moist, some of that moisture from the air can freeze and partially block the flow of the carb. This is most common when the outside air temp is in the mid 30s. Air much colder than that just doesn't hold enough moisture. If the air is much warmer than that the evaporative cooling isn't enough to cause icing. Once your car sputters to a stop after freezing up the ice quickly melts and you can restart and drive on never knowing what the problem was. Modern gasoline seems to have this problem more frequently than I recall from my youth. So to resolve these two problems automakers added heating devices to warm the input air.

Well of course we all know that when an engine can breathe in cooler and more dense air it will produce more power. So these pre-heat devices are made to switch to allowing in fresh un-heated air once the engine is warm. So why did I and many others go out of our way to remove them? Well for one thing the moveable metal flaps seem to always find a way to rattle and clang. Sure the makers padded them but that padding wore off after the first few years of use. I got tired of listening to the racket and tired of trying to replace the padding. And also someone convinced me that even with the flap fully opened there was still a slight narrowing of the air inlet passage. And since I so often operate the car at wide open throttle and high RPM, I just couldn't take a chance on any air restriction. So I removed the pre-heat devices and ducted the air intakes directly from the carb air cleaners to the fresh air source ahead of the radiator.

Well without putting too fine a point on it let me just say that now I have become intimately familiar with the carb icing experience.



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
