PARTS CLEANERS

Has anyone else noticed how much brake cleaners/parts washers have been improved? Back in the day we always washed our parts in gasoline. 

The restoration took seven years. The 4 tandem wheels in front each have their own bearings and brakes and the tires were produced from original molds and cost \$23,000 each



Family of Triumph Enthusiast Donates to MC in His Memory

f you had watched Don Carter lay down checkerboard carpet squares for a car show, you would have seen his commitment to perfection and attention to detail.

Mike Hado was a lifelong friend of Don Carter – who was a Texas native, expert architect specializing in hospitals, and Triumph enthusiast. Hado related a story about Carter from the 1989 AutoRama (America's Premier Car Show) in Houston. They were laying black and gray carpet tiles down in a checkerboard pattern, when Carter pointed out they were doing it wrong.

Hado protested, until Carter flipped a tile over and showed him that each tile had a directional arrow on the underside. If those didn't point the same way, the nap on the carpet would have different shades under the bright lights.

Louise Carter, Don's wife, said it was a great example of her husband's commitment to excellence in even the smallest details of

"He knew how to make things as perfect as possible and he would take the time and energy it took to get things right that most people don't," Louise said. "Don was committed to doing things right, or he

Don Carter passed away on Oct. 10, 2013, survived by his wife; his daughter, Heather and son-in-law Marc, his step-son, Dustin and daughter-in-law Brandi; four grandchildren; and his award-winning 1974 Triumph TR-6, as mentioned in his memorial program. Louise said he took five years to restore the Triumph TR-6. He appreciated the body style, and - as a self-taught "shade tree mechanic" - loved that he could work on its simple mechanics on his own. Louise recalled how he patiently helped mentor others in the Texas Triumph Register club on how to set up and drive an autocross course properly, and how he would take extended phone calls from complete strangers who needed help on some point of difficulty with

When he passed, Louise said that she had a hard time deciding where the family could lend support in a way that would honor Don's legacy and his passion for classic cars. When they learned

of McPherson College's automotive restoration program, and the associated Summer Institute, they knew it was a place Don would have loved.

After touring McPherson College last summer, Louise was very impressed with the college's commitment to a high-quality education and the automotive restoration program.

In researching higher education programs they initially looked at Texas colleges, but was surprised there were virtually no automotive restoration degrees offered. "Finding McPherson and their commitment to this level of program was very exciting."

To that end, the Carter family has donated to McPherson College to help students afford to attend school to learn more about vintage

"Our goal is both to honor Don and all he did for our club, but it's also to encourage young people to remember these vintage cars. Learning how to restore these cars properly is important to their longevity and encouraging interest in the Triumph Marque."
