

TECH SESSION RESTO EVALUATION

Steve Velhewald arranged a gathering at his garage on Saturday, May 20th for the purpose of evaluating the possible rebuild of a 1973 TR6. Brief history: After a site-unseen, long-distance purchase in 2017, he discovered a very rusted frame with repairs made to stabilize bad spots. A donor frame was found, but it too had issues. On the positive side, the car has a beautiful interior, strong engine with a twin Weber setup and Pimento Red paint in great shape. The project has been on hold for five years, but Steve is now ready to start, and looking for opinions on how to proceed. Sixteen club members helped with the evaluation.

With the car up on a lift, a startling amount of rust was evident. Attempts had been made to repair the trailing arm box supports, but even the repair patches were badly rusted. The drivers-side floor pan was shot and the passenger side marginal. The trunk pan had some perforation but was patchable. The donor frame will need work but was deemed usable. Steve would like to make this a club project and will call for assistance when the work warrants it.

Contained within a 20,000 sq. ft. heated warehouse in mid-town KCMO, 40 individual car bays are available for rent on a monthly basis with no long-term commitment. Rent for a short-term project or stay long-term and make it your Man Cave! Many cities have high-dollar "Auto County Clubs" where you sit at a bar, smoke cigars and look through a picture window at your car in a posh showroom. There are also condo garages that can cost as much as a house.

Your Classic Ride is something different. It has a roll-up-your-sleeves atmosphere. Instead of a bar, you'll find a refrigerator full of beer with a sign on its door advising; Take a beer, Return a Six Pack. The cost is not much more than renting a car size, public storage shed. Although every car is a classic in some way, the more rare vehicles are a '49 Packard Woody, '58 Batwing El Camino, 40s Willys Jeep, '14 Model T, '48 Harvester Truck painted with the livery of a local distillery and '60 MGA resto-mod with a Cosworth Duratec motor. For the Brit Fans, there are nine LBCs (five Triumphs and four MGs).

YCR can be used as a storage facility but is best intended for those looking to maintain or restore their cars. Heavy equipment includes a four-post lift, ramps, drill press, 20-ton press, battery charger, shop vac, hydraulic wheel dollies, compressor for air tools and a large assortment of hand tools. Other services are oil and scrap metal disposal, car wash station, and towel wash & drying. Amenities are a large meeting room for club functions, kitchen and bathrooms. Best of all is 24/7 full access!

Owner/Manager, Tom Ricker, hosts an annual charity event attended by over 100 car guys in support of a local high school's mechanics training program. It's held the night before the KC Mecum Auto Auction and features a Mecum speaker along with a fried chicken dinner. The setting is right in the warehouse with the cars! 

WEDGE WORDS By Steve Olson

Much has been written about carbs and back before fuel injection put them out of business there were teams of scientists working full time to make carbs the best that they could be. The carb has only one job to do and that is mix the air and fuel in the proper proportions for whatever throttle setting and load the engine is experiencing at the moment. Science tells us that the best ratio for light cruise is around 14 parts air to 1 part gas. Under heavy load that is maybe 12 to 1. So the job should be simple, right? Well add to that is managing emission levels, getting the best fuel economy, and making the most possible power. For our hobby cars, we might tend to reverse the order of those on our priority list.

Luckily the constant depression, variable venturi SU's and Zenith Stromberg carbs are very forgiving and can be tuned infinitely. Your carb probably has more than a dozen different needles that have been designed for it. Engineers spent many hours testing and measuring to come up with which one is best for your engine. But "improvements" as simple as free-flowing exhaust systems or easier-breathing air cleaners make those carefully engineered needles no longer the optimum. Selecting needles from the list of available is a bit of a black art and probably just a crap shoot. We probably want needles that are skinnier near the point and maybe just a tad thinner in the middle than stock. How much thinner and pointier is something you will have to decide.

Back in the late 1950s, my pal had a '50 Chevy inline 6 that he wanted to improve. He split the exhaust manifold and added a second exhaust. It sounded way cooler but probably didn't run a bit faster. On the used junk market there were multi-carb manifolds available for a hundred bucks or so. Back then that was more than we made in two weeks. But he saved up and bought one with twin carbs, chrome air cleaners, and the linkage to hook it up. We put it on the car. It was almost impossible to get it started. Old 6volt starters didn't spin the engine very quickly so little air was flowing through the carbs to draw fuel out of the jet. And at idle and low RPM it suffered the same problem. We tried changing jets and probably guessed the wrong direction. We were too clueless to know what needed to be done. All we knew was that two chrome air cleaners and twin carbs on a



polished aluminum manifold that was labeled FEN-TON or maybe it was OFFENHAUSER looked way cooler than that dirty old single with its oil bath air cleaner. After just a couple weeks of looking cool, he sold the setup to some other sucker.

Multi carbs instead of just one big single addressed the problem of equal fuel distribution. On inline 6 and 8-cylinder engines, the cylinders closest to the carb tend to be rich while the ones furthest away are lean. Great on average. Try standing with one foot in a block of ice and the other in a pan of boiling water. On average you are comfortable, but you probably won't be happy. We knew nothing about fluid dynamics and had no instruments to measure individual cylinder mixtures, but we could see the spark plugs were different colors depending on their nearness to the carb. Common sense is usually a pretty good substitute for science.

So the logical solution is multiple carbs. The trade-offs are the increased cost of the extra carb and the additional maintenance to keep them operating in sync. Two carbs are not just twice as much hassle they are more like four times as much. Three carbs are probably ten times as much hassle or maybe more. American car makers knew their market and the skill level of dealership mechanics so decided to just add bigger motors that didn't need to be all that efficient. Due to tax laws and fuel prices, the Brits didn't have that option. So now we get to tinker endlessly with multiple carb setups striving for perfection. And we love doing it. It has to be a sickness that no vaccine can cure.

WHY HAVE A CB RADIO FOR TRAVELING?

One question raised by travelers is, why would anyone consider a CB radio when a smartphone is in their pocket? The simple answer is: CBs can be inherently useful. They are reliable, inexpensive, have no ongoing costs and most importantly, provide a means of communicating when your cell phone won't work.


CB radios provide a means of communication when you are out of cell range and you can't talk, text, or stream data. A CB can communicate anywhere, even under poor conditions. This is particularly helpful if you're traveling the back roads. Even if you can't make a cell call, CBs provides a way of getting assistance if you need it. Channel 9 is the designated emergency channel; it's monitored by emergency services and local volunteers known as REACT (Radio Emergency Associated Communication Teams), so help is almost always available.

Unlike your phone, which is limited to a single conversation, you can have a group conversation on a CB. When traveling with a group you are able to keep everyone informed of directions, stops and emergencies.

A CB is a reliable means of communication not dependent on cell towers, electricity, or local media.

There are many websites that give information on the best CB's and how to install. Consider purchasing and installing before your next road trip.


