Most of us aren't as bright as we could be and neither are the taillights on our cars. The Little British Car Company and probably several other vendors offer a solution, halogen replacement bulbs. They plug right in and are much brighter. They also draw a lot more juice and produce a lot more heat that might have adverse effects on our old wiring and aged lenses. At about \$10 each they also pose a threat to our net worth statements.

But now I read in the MGB Driver magazine, which goes to all members of the National MGB Register, that a cheap and simple solution is available. The original bulbs are 1157's and can be found anywhere. These have two filaments, one for the taillight and one for the brake light. They give off 2 and 32 candlepower respectively. But if you substitute 2357s, which are an exact replacement size, you get 3 and 40 candlepower. The extra juice needed is minimal and very little extra heat is generated. I tried a pair and the flasher winked at the same speed as always. You may have to look a bit to find 2357's. Any decent auto parts house should have them in stock or at least be able to order you some. Expect to pay less than \$2 per pair. See, I told you this was a cheap way to improve your TR.

And when you remove the lenses to change the bulbs, make sure to use a soft cloth and very gently wipe the dust off the reflectors behind the bulb. And a good soap and water bath for the inside of the lenses will allow a lot more light shine through.

With these new bulbs and clean lenses you give the SUV or 18 wheeler behind you a better chance to see you and know that you are braking.



The Great River Road

This past May we drove part of the Great River Road for a week's vacation. This route is a system of secondary roads that parallels the Mississippi River from the Gulf of Mexico to Canada. We drove the back-roads across Missouri, because I don't consider traveling I-70 east from Kansas City part of a vacation. I can fight for my life in the workday world, thank you very much. As the week for the trip neared the weather had been spring's usual rainy, thunder-y, wind-blowing best, and we debated long about the car to take: Honda, Mazda, Triumph; Honda, Mazda, Triumph. Finally, the day before we left the Weather Cannel online predicted 5 days out of clear sunny weather. Why do I ever believe them?

We took the TR. The first night we spent east of St. Louis to see Cahokia Mounds historic site. As Indian ruins go (if you call a mound a ruin – isn't it the same shape as it started?) it was impressive and worth ½ day of interest if you're in the area. We then headed north along the east side of the Mississippi River northeast of St. Louis, in Illinois. Along high bluffs along the river edge we cruised tiny towns and spent three nights at Pere Marquette State Park in a cabin built by the Civilian Conservation Corps. They built a huge lodge there too, and managed to put in a really top-quality restaurant. They were really thinking ahead in the '30s.

Who knew Illinois was so beautiful? This park was gorgeous, and we hiked miles of trails and drove through winding forested roads with scenic overlooks to the Illinois River. Oh, did I mention the weather changed? Our first night in the park the forecast for St. Louis was severe thunderstorms with damaging winds. Basic Triumph dilemma: do I leave my car under the trees to have some protection from hail? Or will tree branches coming down from a storm be more even more hazardous? We moved the car to the east of one of the cabins out from under the trees and hoped for the best. All turned out well, but I'll be more cautious about spring trips in the future.

One evening we stood quietly along the Illinois River bank while a great blue heron came and fished within 20 feet of us. There were as many herons in the area as there are crows here in Kansas. And while we were standing there, a river otter swam by and then fished in circles out in the water. Otters look like they have a lot of fun.

Leaving the area to drive north, we crossed the rivers to the Missouri side. Pere Marquette is located just upstream of where the Mississippi meets the Illinois. So, we crossed both rivers on ferries to get back to Missouri. The first ferry was large enough for a tractor-trailer to use and had traffic all day long. People used it for commuting to work. We met one of the men working there the day before we were to use the ferry to discuss the problem of the shallow draft, and I don't mean the boat's. He said they had antique cars cross all the time and thought we'd be safe getting the car aboard. He was right. Then we drove a few miles across the peninsula looking for the second ferry. About the time the road was narrowed to one lane, we turned a corner and there was the ferry waiting. A man opened the gate for us, closed it and drove us across – just our car.

On the Missouri side of the river, you drive along high banks with some wonderful views. On both sides of the state line, the road goes through wonderful old river towns.

We stayed overnight at the hotel in Nauvoo, an early settlement of the Mormon church. They've built a replica of the old town. One home you can tour belonged to Jonathan Browning, who established his gun business from the attached shop. He invented and built a repeating rifle and six-shot repeater. His home and shop tour is worthwhile for anyone interested in old firearms. The house was right on main street, which got a lot of the traffic up and down. There was a rapids in the Mississippi at Nauvoo, and steamboat passengers, luggage and freight had to be unloaded to get the boat over the shallow bed. The passengers walked through town upstream or downstream to get on the boat again and continue the journey. Think about that the next time you're feeling inconvenienced about at a TSA search at the airport.

You know, for years I've read the articles telling you how to install a backup hood release for TRs. For years I've told myself I should do that. You should do that. In the hotel parking lot at Nauvoo I took the heater hoses, dash support bracket and glove box out of the TR trying to get the hood open. I wasn't even close. Roger eventually pulled the original hood release handle hard enough to get the latch to work. A substandard hood release cable was the culprit, and Roger has since devised a backup that hangs inside the passenger foot well. Such are the things that make an interesting Triumph trip!

From Nauvoo we drove to Galena and spent three days in this lovely old town. We went east one day to go hiking in a state park. We drove to nearby Dubuque to visit the Mississippi River Museum, a beautiful facility to see all kinds of animals as well as the overall effect and history of this waterway. Well worth the time. Other guests at our B&B had gone antique shopping, and reported good luck. Galena has a lot of fun shops, which we breezed through, but I know others of you have fun shopping.

Leaving the area to come back to Kansas we drove through the Amana Colonies in eastern Iowa. Fun shopping, good food and a change in culture. One of my favorite travel combinations. It was Sunday when we headed for home again. Leaving Amana, the sky to the west was turning dark, and we ran into light rain. All across Iowa we turned the car south then west then south then west, trying to avoid what looked like serious storms. We finally stopped for supper in Missouri, and then driving straight south we could see wave after wave of clouds stretching out to the west. After one rain band passed over, we could see two more behind it. Amazing. We got home with the car safely; and I was blown to pieces by Triumph air conditioning (rear window zipped open), long hours and fast speed. Wonderful trip!

We enjoyed the Great River Road, and believe we'll travel it again. Maybe start in St. Louis and go south next time. And there's still a lot to see farther north, too. TRIUMPH MOTORCYCLES & MOTORCARS

At the recent planning meeting, I heard someone say the Triumph motorcars & motorcycles were never the same company. Here then is some Triumph history circa 1896-1936.

Siegfried Bettman, a German Jew, immigrated to England in 1883. The 21-year-old could speak German French and English fluently and worked a couple of years as a translator. Bicycles were becoming quite popular, and seeing a business opportunity he contracted with a local manufacturing firm to build the two-wheelers for him to export to Europe. The new product needed a name. Some of his customers on the continent called it the "Bettman", but he felt it needed a name that would be understood in all European languages. We have to be pleased that he gave it the name "TRIUMPH".

In 1887, Siegfried took on a partner, Maurice Schulte and with his expertise and money they leased a works and began manufacturing their own bicycles. Located at Much Park Street in Coventry it was titled "Triumph Cycle Co. Ltd.". By the turn of the century it was a logical evolution for bicycle companies to adapt a small gas engine to their heaviest frames and offer powered cycles. Schulte was keen on this and by 1902 the first Triumph Motorcycle hit the streets. A 1905 magazine ad asserted: "The Triumph Motor Cycle is not an experiment, but an article of proven value. It is made throughout in our own works, by experienced workmen only, no female whatever being employed". (Well that wouldn't fly today, would it.)

At the beginning of the Great War in 1914, Triumph was the largest Motorcycle Company in Great Britain and Bettman was the mayor of Coventry. Colonel Claude Holbrook contracted the company to supply motorcycles for the war effort. The lucrative contract resulted in 30,000 "Trusty Triumphs" used by British and allied forces.

Following the war, Bettman bought out Schulte because Schulte wanted to sell off the motorcycles and build automobiles. Bettman hired Col. Holbrook who soon pushed the company into auto production! The first Triumph motorcar was the 1923 Triumph 10/20. (The first number was the RAC horsepower rating for tax purposes and the second, the actual horsepower.) Many improved car and motorcycle models followed through the twenties and early thirties. It was decided to form the Triumph Motor Car Co. to join the Triumph Cycle Co.

By 1929 Col. Holbrook was the managing director of Triumph and although motorcycle production was 30,000 per year, the stock market crash damaged the company. The creditor bank took over and demoted Bettman to vice chairman and sold off the bicycle plant to another company that later became part of Raleigh.


Holbrook was increasingly interested in upgrading the motorcar side and in 1933 began developing the Gloria line of Triumph cars. All Gloria's were powered by Coventry Climax 4 & 6 cylinder engines and were well equipped with permanent jacking systems, windscreen washers, self canceling turn indicators, tachometer, clock and metallic paint. Their motto was "Smartest cars in the land" and were exceptional motorcars since accepted as Classic Status by the American Classic Car Club. These cars and motorcycles carried the now famous **Triumph** script with the sweeping **R** connected to the **H**.

Unfortunately the car side was not profitable and the bank creditor decided to sell off the motorcycle business and put the resources into car production. In January 1936, Jack Sangster bought Triumph's motorcycle operation and retained the use of the Triumph name. Although motorcycle registrations were dropping rapidly and auto use was on the increase, the new Triumph motorcycle Co. fared far better than the auto side which went bankrupt in 1939, to be purchased after the world war 11 by Standard Motor Company.

So there you have it! Triumph Motorcars ended finally in 1982, and Triumph Motorcycles celebrated 100 years in 2002. Put a **TRIUMPH** in your day.



Organize your Triumph for travel

It's Spring, and I'll bet you're thinking, "It's time to get the Triumph on the road! Events and trips are coming up!" And you might also be thinking how that rear shelf behind the driver's and passenger's seats isn't all that convenient for carrying travel necessities. The stuff slides off. They wedge behind the seats, making it hard to move the seat back for a taller driver. They fall into the dark abyss – who knows where they go? Sometimes they disappear for years down there.

Last year before our Great River Road trip, we found a handy solution, and I'll call it car luggage. The manufacturer calls it a trunk organizer. Found it online at aaa.com, and wondered how big it was, since they don't tell you that. Even if you find this particular model in its box, the box doesn't give you the dimensions. This apparently was designed for people who don't CARE what the dimensions are, and that's OK, because it works perfect well for Triumphs, too.

It's a collapsible, vinyl-covered box: 22x13.5x10(h) inches. There are handles on the ends so you can lift it in or out of the car. There are mesh- and solid-fabric pockets on the outside. The top even folds across and zips shut, and it, too, has a mesh pocket to put items in. There are moveable dividers inside for organizing. The nice thing is, the mesh lets you see what's in those outside pockets. Here's the most important thing: it keeps stuff on the shelf! Before this, our carefully stowed maps, cookies, water bottles, binoculars, cameras and hats flew off that shelf at the second stop sign from home – ½ mile from the house. It made for very messy, disorganized travel. We were always searching for things under the seats, which means getting out of the car, looping back the seat belt, unlatching and lifting the seat ... you know the drill.

I highly recommend one of these. This one from AAA is sturdy but doesn't fold down very small. It folds to the purchase box size, which is 3" deep. (I have seen other brands of lighter-weight organizers that fold flatter. I don't know what their quality is – you'll need to check that out yourself.) We bought this one at the AAA store on Metcalf in Overland Park, and they're available online at \$20.50 for members and \$24.99 for non-members. It sure can make the trip more organized, and you can actually store more items back there. Better yet, you can find them again. Probably works well for trunks, too. 

All British Show: New Diamond in the Rough Class

The All British has changed; that's a good thing and a bad thing.

If you've been going to the All British for several years, you've seen a lot that's changed. A generation of car owners, for one thing. You can't count on seeing all of your old friends there. Another thing that's changed is the quality of the cars. It makes sense after some of us spent years restoring our cars, that the overall condition of the cars at the All Brit has moved upscale.

Years ago, there were a lot of daily drivers at the show, and they <u>looked like</u> daily drivers. People brought cars they just had hopes for; they came to get inspired by cars like theirs.
