
- Personally attend every function (I will apologize now since we will be in Europe again this spring)


We missed all of you that weren't able to make the dinner, but hope to see you at the Planning Meeting, January 26 at Janet & Kevin Smith's new home.







REFLECTIONS ON OUR YEARS TO 1993 WITH THE KANSAS CITY TRIUMPHS

Some time ago, Jack asked me to write an article for the newsletter describing our involvement and experiences with the KC Triumphs Club. Of course, I indicated I would be interested in doing so. Thanks to Paul McBride for loaning me his complete set of the newsletters, after several hours of interesting reading, I was able to piece together the dates Marilyn and I have been participating. We were not original (1978) members of the club, but joined soon after meeting with Paul at the May, 1982 Heart of America Jaguar Club Concours d' Elegance held at the Doubletree Hotel in Overland Park where Paul and others had their TR's on display. It has been a wonderful group to be associated with ever since, although I admit we have not been as active since the mid-1990's when I worked in Indonesia, then we moved to Pasadena, California for almost three years (and the TR6 was up on blocks for that period).

We have known many of the early members for a long time, and consider them all as good friends who brought enthusiasm to our club – Paul and Margaret McBride, Gary Davis, Herb and Wanda Moore (Herb passed away a few years ago), Rick Torres, Bob and Esther White (Bob also passed away last year), Richard and Virginia (also passed away) Peak, Larry and Linda Birks, Richard and Ann Woody, Jim Brady and Cynthia Yin, John and Nancy Maas, TR and Joni Wilson, Woody Underwood, and many others.

We purchased and drove our 1976 TR6 home on September 12, 1977, the day of the Plaza flood, and watched the flooding Indian Creek rise up on our driveway, surround our home, and creep into the garage - fortunately not actually even touching the tires, but causing a lot of anguish that night. Our car had been traded in on a new Chevy by Sam Carter, the mayor of Liberty, Missouri, at that time. It had 14801 miles on it when we purchased it, now has about 32,500 miles on the odometer, and it still looks and runs great. In recent years we have not driven it much, as is obvious, but for the first few years I drove it to work whenever the weather was good, to Lake of the Ozarks for our annual treks, once to the St. Louis All British, and to many club events in the KC area including an autocross and about ten laps at Heartland Park in Topeka. Other than replacing the clutch release bearing twice, and the brake and clutch master cylinders, it has been quite reliable. We have shown the car most years at the All British when we were in town, and it has won a number of awards for which we are proud. Our first show was the September 1982 1st Annual All British Meet held at the Drury Inn in Overland Park.

In June of 1983 we joined the club for our first trip on what became the annual Lake of the Ozarks club tour, with dining at what was then a new restaurant, Bentley's, where the restaurant made a special parking space for our Triumphs.

This is still an excellent restaurant, and perhaps we will dine there during the July 12 weekend TR event.

Herb and Wanda Moore hosted the club several times at their home in Windsor, Missouri, complete with a roasted whole pig. Herb and Wanda may have lived far from Kansas City, but they participated in almost all events in their bright yellow TR3. Herb was a master mechanic and Pearl Harbor veteran, a wonderful man with a wonderful wife. At our June 1984 Lake of the Ozarks tour, where we stayed at the Town and Country Motel just south of the bridge on Hwy 54 (we stayed there for several years, it is still there under new management and was refurbished and expanded a few years ago) we passed around and enjoyed, again, Herb's "bucket", a most refreshing but loaded juice on ice in what looked like a milking bucket. The bucket made frequent appearances at the All British meets as well as on the lake tours. The recipe is a mystery to me. On the return trip that year we met "George" a very large male turkey at a farm where we had stopped for a rest from the winding roads. George wandered over to us to make friends.

The All British in 1984 was held at the Overland Park Marriott Hotel, where one of the entrants was a Triumph-powered Amphicar (only 3,500 were produced in Germany between 1961 and 1967, with a rear-mounted 43 hp Triumph Herald engine). I had not seen one since I lived in Vancouver in the early 1960's, when I had followed one on a waterfront road and watched the driver, with three passengers, calmly drive over the beach sand into the salt water harbor. There are at least two currently owned by a man at the Lake of the Ozarks, not far from our condo. He takes folks on rides in the lake at the boat races in September to benefit a charity.

Following the KC All British in 1984 ten cars traveled to the St. Louis All British Meet, held at the Museum of Transportation. We won a 1st place trophy for the TR4-6 class at that event, and all had a great time. Gary Davis' TR3 had spark coil problems on the return trip, so he simply replaced it from the spare parts he had on board.

In January 1985 Marilyn and I began as Secretary/Treasurer of the KC Triumphs Club. My primary goal was to get the club on a common date for dues payment, the All British date, in order to save individual mailing costs each month reminding folks of their dues, and to significantly reduce the chore of keeping track of when dues were owed by everyone. It took several months to get this done, but it was worthwhile. We also began helping Richard Peak with preparation and mailing of the Newsletter, for which he was the Editor at the time.

In March 1985, Marilyn and I hosted a club "Soup and Stuff" party at our home, and this became an annual event for us until 1992. In June of 1985 KC played host to the KC Grand Prix racing near the Liberty Memorial. This was a terrific

event, with vintage racing around the nearby roads. It was extraordinary entertainment for car buffs, but unfortunately a one-time event for the city.

In January 1987 TR Wilson took over from Gary Davis as Club Director, Ted Honig began as Assistant Director, Ricci and Marice Ballesteros took over the Newsletter from Richard Peak, and we continued as Secretary/Treasurer. Two years later, Marilyn and I became Assistant Director, with Ted Honig as Director, Jim Brady as Secretary/Treasurer, and Joni Wilson as Editor of the Newsletter. In September 1990 Ted left the Club, so I took over as Director. Dick Luthy became Assistant Director in January 1991, and his wife Margaret took over as the Newsletter editor.

We had shown our TR6 at every All British Meet from 1982 until the meet in September 1992, held at Heartland Park, Topeka, when an alternator abandoned us the night before the meet - what a disappointment. At the Annual Dinner in 1992 Jim Brady and Cynthia Yin took over from me as Director, Randy and Ann Atkins became Assistant Director, Charlie and Melanie Hoch became Secretary/Treasurer, and Pat Fischer took over as Editor of the Newsletter.

It had been a "great ride" for Marilyn and I for about eight years as club officers. Thanks to so many avid and dedicated members, it was a most enjoyable experience.A few months later I was working in Jakarta, Indonesia, and our TR6 began its next three years under the car cover.

Here is how to get there, allowing about 2-1/2 to 3 hours (158 miles from McBean's in Overland Park). (Gas is cheaper in Warrensburg or Sedalia than anywhere in KC.) Take US 50 from Lees Summit, through Sedalia, to the town of Tipton (about 20 miles east of Sedalia), US 5 South from Tipton for about 15 miles to US 52. Left on 52 to Eldon, turn right at McDonald's on 52 Business and head east to US 54. South (turn right) on 54 for about 9 miles, at the light take the right-hand turn to US 54 Business to cross the dam. About a mile past the dam (Twig's will be on the left) turn right at the light on HH (Horseshoe Bend Parkway). Drive about 4 miles (to about one mile past the entrance to the Lodge of the Four Seasons) to Cherokee Road, turn right and go 1-1/2 miles to the Steeple Ridge Condos. There are 8 white buildings in the complex, stretching along Cherokee Road. McBean's are in the seventh building across from the garage, at 1600 Cherokee, Unit 2C (upstairs right end, flag will be out, our car in the garage). Call at (573) 365-9876 (condo phone) or (913) 226-4124 (Marilyn's cell phone) if you get lost.

There are many motels at the lake, either in the town of Lake Ozark or in Osage Beach, but we suggest you make a reservation in advance because this is the busiest time of the year. Here are a few you can try:

IRS Triumphs 4A-6, Stag and the notorious TR-3 rear hubs can resist tons of pressure. Most pullers exacerbate the problem by applying force that tightens the taper. Craig has a \$700 Snap-on tool that protects the flange integrity and the stub axle threads and when properly set up, using many accessory pieces, made quick work of a difficult job. There is NOTHING as good as having the proper tool for the job. Thanks to Craig for the lesson and the donuts! Following the session we convened at Edward's new BBQ place down on SW Boulevard. Great food. (Favorably reviewed by the STAR's Food Editor)


POWELL GARDENS:


Ed,

The interior needs to be redone and could use a new top. It definitely has potential. I have never had any problems with the engine. I know it needs a clutch line. It has overdrive. FOR AT RIVERSIDE TRIUMPH

couthern California racing fans don't know what real racing is. Story thousand turned out for the Times Grand Prix and watched and long race with characteristics strongly reminiscent of a parade. Less than twenty thousand came to Riverside International Raceway for the American Road Race of Champions but they saw some racing: Fourteen nose-to-tail, side-by-side, never-give-an-inch races made for the efficienado, each half-hour leaving the crowd

limp.

We've been at all their Riverside ARRC's and to one at Daytona. There's a fine through of tension stretched from car to car all through the pits. Crew members work furiously, smoke and talk with almost vicious energy, never let down for a moment. Drivers stride back and forth, driving suits are sharp, often new, conversation is crisp and the usual "war stories" are tempered by one vibrating fact. There's 1835 by to impress here. This is the big one . . . every driver is topostivery car is well-prepared, every story rates a hearing because it's for real. This time, when the flag falls rates a hearing because it's for real. This time, when the flag falls for the first race and every race, there will be no smoking clunkers at the back of the grid. They all have a chance because they're all leaders. That's what makes the ARRC.

Twenty-eight Triumph drivers competed in five ARRC events. They won three firsts, a second and two thirds.

E PRODUCTION

The 1967 Class EP champ was Lee Midgley, driving a TR-3. Back this year, Lee sat on the front of the grid in an orange Alfa Duetto. Searche grid all we could, we couldn't find a TR-3. For the first time, game were present. Second place Northeast TR-3 driver, Bob Krokus, had earned a ride in the Kastner-prepared GT-6 and washadd in fifth spot.

Rolling starts are a new ARRC policy. While it seems unusual that drivers who can standing starts all year should have to use an

that drivers who run standing starts all year should have to use an unfamiliar met od in the national championships, the rolling start was decreed in the gause of safety and qualitative. As a safety

factor it worked well with only two starting-line tangles of any consequence. In execution, for the first several races it was by turns comical and infuriating. The EP start was the worst.

Having had nothing but a sketchy briefing just prior to the race, the drivers failed to close up on the first attempt, straggling all the way back from the start-finish to the exit of the last turn, even after a full lap behind the pace car. A second-row Porsche driven by Bob Kirby, jumped the flag and passed the front row, necessitating a wave-off. However, the front half of the field didn't get the message and began racing despite waving yellow flags at each corner. They all gradually realized the situation and fell into line again, the last one, Krokus, receiving a red flag at the start-finish.

The field, completely disorganized, was reassembled and sent around again. Meanwhile, Krokus had shut off the engine in the GT and had trouble re-starting. Only a lucky use of brains and reverse gear on the slight incline where he had stopped got him going again and he was forced to go most of the lap at racing speeds to regain his position. Following the green flag, he ran among the leaders for five laps only to be sidelined abruptly, in clouds of dust, at turn four with a broken axle.

Midgley relinquished his title to Mike Eyerly in a Porsche, the Alfa not quite able to stay ahead. Fortunately, following this race, the stewards arranged that the starts be made after only a portion of a lap behind the pace car and that the rolling speed be very slow, allowing the drivers to bunch up for a good start.

F PRODUCTION

Brian Fuerstenau, of Group 44, set a new FP lap record in Friday qualifying. 1:44:44. Omens are omens but Lee Mueller, Southern Pacific champ and driving a Kastner-prepared Mk-3 Spitfire, wasn't going to be bothered. His time was less than a


